Course Structure

The Graduate Certificate, Graduate Diploma and Master of Business (HRM) form a nested program. A nested program is a sequence of courses which is followed to obtain the highest available award and which has multiple entry and exit points. This structure allows students the flexibility to qualify for the ultimate award or exit at an earlier stage. Students may not receive multiple awards for continuous study in a nested program.

The Master of Business (HRM) requires successful completion of 12 subjects.

Master of Business (HRM) Honours (A196H)

The Master of Business HRM (Honours) requires students to complete an additional four subjects (50 Credit points). Students may choose these four elective subjects from the above listed asterisked* Stage 3 subjects provided they have not already completed them at their master level of studies OR from any of the Postgraduate Programs currently on offer in the Faculty of Business and Enterprise or other Swinburne faculties, subject to approval from the Program Director.

NOTE: The award of Honours is subject to students completing 200 credit points of study AND attaining a 70 percent average over the final 100 credit points OR, a 75 percent average over the final 50 credit points.

Students who complete 200 credit points but who do not attain the required performance level to receive the award with Honours may graduate with the Master of Business (HRM) award.
