



Honours Component - Stage 3 Subjects Application Form

Students enrolled in participating Stage 3 subjects can apply to study an Honours component. The aim is to provide students with an additional challenge and opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of the subject whilst carrying out additional/comprehensive research tasks. (Refer to page 2 for assessment guidelines). The Stage 3 Honours component **will not** be available for subjects undertaken in the summer semester.

Eligibility Criteria

Students are eligible to enrol in a Stage 3 honours component subject if:

- They have an overall credit average (65+) in subjects completed to date.
- The subject is part of a major the student is completing and they have achieved a credit average (65+) in the major subjects completed towards that major.

Please return this form, with a copy of your academic transcript (results) and a completed Amendment to Enrolment form, to the Undergraduate Office, Room AGSE114.

Note: Students will be notified in writing of the outcome of their application. Successful applicants will be enrolled in the Honours component subject.

Stage 3 Honours Component - Assessment Guidelines

The assessment for the Honours component will include:

- An individual written Research Project – normally 50% or more of the final grade, incorporating an extended Literature Review. The balance of the assessment will be determined by the subject convenor.
- Demonstrated deeper level of research skills and understanding of subject matter.
- Demonstrated ability to undertake critical analysis.

The grades awarded to each element of assessment and score ranges allocated follow guidelines set by the Division of Higher Education.

Students who do not meet the required pass standard on the individual written assessment will be looked at on an individual case to determine if resubmission is an option.
