

INDUSTRY PLACEMENT AND INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE INFORMATION FOR RE-ENROLLING 1st YEAR STUDENTS

It is important to consider your options early on in your degree.

Students interested in completing an International Exchange semester or Industry Placement should be aware that each option is considered to take the place of a minor. If you were to complete an International Exchange *and* Industry Placement, you will not be able to complete a Co-major or Minor.

Industry Placement

To be considered for selection into the Industry Placement program an applicant must have completed:

- Between 16–18 Units of Study (200–225 credit points).
Of this total:
 - a minimum of 8 Units of Study (100 cp) must be completed within Swinburne's Faculty of Design.
 - a minimum of 12 Units of Study (150 cp) are from a Professional Major program.
 - a maximum of 6 Units of Study (75 cp) are from Minors or a Co-Major.
(Please note: an Industry Placement student will not be able to complete a Co-Major).

Students must also

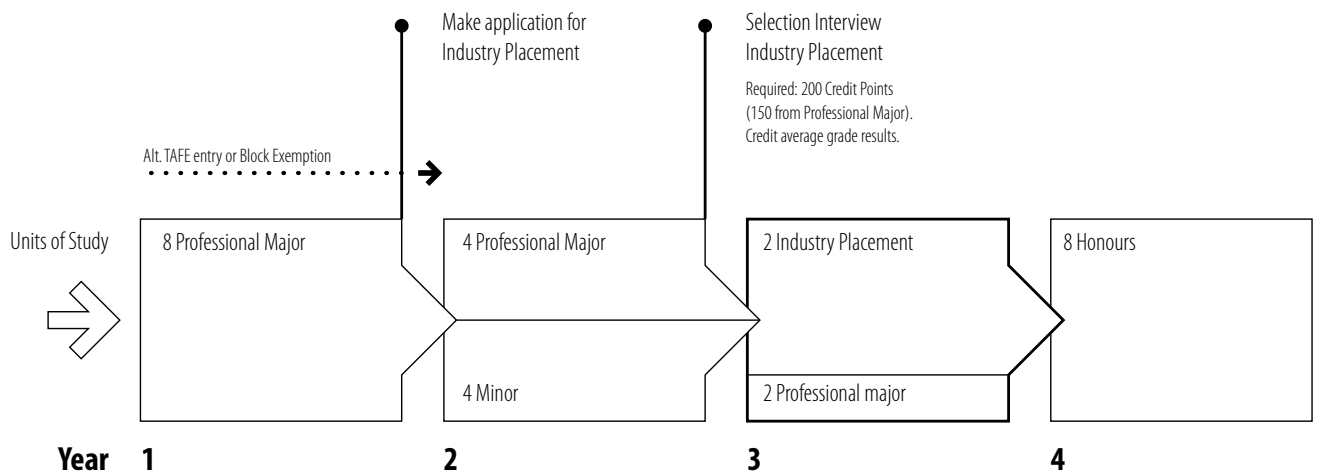
- Achieve a minimum Credit average (65%) in your two most recent semesters.
- Participate in the selection process in order to be eligible.

Successful Industry Placement applicants would then be required to complete

- Two [2] further units from their professional major (25 cp) in their Industry Placement year.
- An Honours year before they would be eligible for an award.
(Please note: once enrolled in Industry Placement, students are ineligible for a Bachelors Degree award).

International Exchange

An Exchange semester counts as a Minor (sequence of four Units of Study) in the Bachelor of Design or the Bachelor of Film and Television. Exchange places are granted on eligibility, availability and interview. Students considering applying for exchange are advised to seek course advice early so that they can plan their enrolment appropriately.

To be eligible for exchange, students must:

At the time of exchange be in either their;

- Second semester of second year, or
- First semester of third year, of the Bachelor program.
- Achieve a minimum Credit average (65%) overall.

Applications for International exchange close each year:

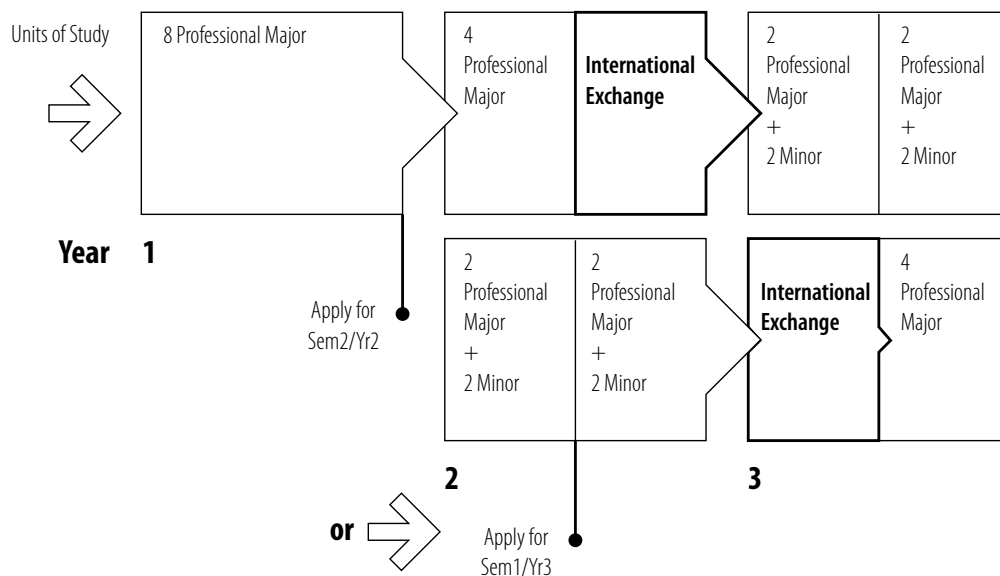
Semester Two

- Early deadline – 15 December (previous year)
- Final deadline – 31 March

Semester One

- Early deadline – 15 June (previous year)
- Final deadline – 31 August (previous year)
