The Bachelor of Aviation (Management) is ideal if you wish to study for a career in the non-flying areas of the aviation industry. Most of the career opportunities in this field are in areas other than flight crew.

This course trains you to become a future professional manager in airline and airport operations positions, including technical management and regulatory positions.

Entry requirements

English language requirements: IELTS 6.0 with no individual band below 6.0.

Indian 10+2 results: 65%, or equivalent Australian ENTER 70.

Prerequisite: Advanced Maths

Course content is guided and supported by an industry advisory committee, comprising representatives from airlines, airports, regulators and safety organisations.

All units of study have been developed by field experts. Students can tailor the course to meet specific objectives by choosing from a range of elective units.

Industry interaction

Industry visits and guest lecturers from industry ensure that there is a high level of interaction with the aviation industry. You also have the option of participating in a three-week aviation industry world study tour.
