Situated in Kalamazoo, this medium sized city of 81,000 inhabitants is situated approx. 2 ½ hour road trip from either Chicago or Detroit and is easily accessed by road, air, rail or bus. The sandy beaches of Lake Michigan are only a 45-minute drive away. The College of Aviation is situated at the W.K. Kellogg Airport in Battle Creek, Michigan located near Kalamazoo.

Study Options

The Faculty of Engineering and Industrial Sciences is offering the opportunity for a group of students to undertake the Education Abroad Program commencing in Semester 2. Students will be selected from second year Bachelor of Aviation and Bachelor of Aviation (Management) students, including those undertaking a double degree with Business.

Selection Criteria

At least a 'Credit' average is required. Candidates may also be asked to attend a selection interview.

How does it work?

While on exchange, you remain enrolled as a Swinburne student. You do not take leave of absence or defer. You will continue to pay whatever university fees and charges you normally pay. Students paying HECS remain liable for a full semester load. Credit will be granted for all work successfully undertaken while on exchange. One semester in Western Michigan is substituted for one semester at Swinburne.

What extra costs are involved?

Clothing, books, supplies, Travel Insurance, Entertainment and other incidentals, Flying Training Costs (if undertaken).

What Financial Assistance is available?

Commonwealth supported students may be eligible to take an OS-HELP Loan from the government, to be added to their HECS repayments. If you are currently receiving Centrelink Youth Allowance you will still be eligible to continue receiving this allowance during the EAP. Students not currently receiving Youth Allowance may be eligible for a living away from home benefit.

Students who do not have a CASA licence may be issued a FAA student licence. Students who have a CASA PPL or CPL licence may elect to convert their licence to a FAA licence.

Students still undertaking CPL training, any flying training and / or experience will be in addition to the approved CASA 150-hour syllabus. No flight time or training sequences can be included as part of the CASA 150 hour syllabus.

Students who have undertaken the CASA IREX exam may log instrument flight time as part of the required aeronautical experience requirements for the Command Instrument Rating.
