SWINBURNE UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY

PURPOSE

The purpose of this document is to set out the terms of reference, composition and operating arrangements of the Swinburne Animal Ethics Committee (SAEC). An Animal Ethics Committee's composition, terms of reference, functions and responsibilities and method of operation must conform to the requirements of the current Australian code for the care and use of animals for scientific purposes (8th Ed), the Victorian Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986, and the Victorian Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 2008.

GOVERNING BODY

This committee reports to the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research and Development).

RESPONSIBILITY

- 1. To ensure that all activities relating to the care and use of animals are conducted in compliance with the code.
- 2. To report to the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research and Development) and regulatory authorities as required.
- 3. To inspect on at least an annual basis faculty/department(s) animal facilities included on the relevant Scientific Procedures Premises Licence(s).
- 4. To review applications for projects and only approve, by the way of consensus, those projects that are ethically acceptable and conform to the requirements of the code.
- 5. To monitor progress of projects and to allow continuation of the approval of projects that are ethically acceptable and conform to the requirements of the code.
- 6. To monitor the care and use of animals, including housing conditions, practices and procedures involved in the care of animals in facilities.

- 7. To take appropriate action regarding unexpected adverse events.
- 8. To take appropriate actions regarding non-compliance.
- 9. To approve guidelines for the care of animals that are bred, held and used for scientific purposes on behalf of the institution.
- 10. Recommending to the institution any measures needed to ensure that regulatory and other relevant standards are maintained.
- 11. Performing all other duties as required by regulatory and other authorities, including with respect to Swinburne and external reporting requirements.

Chair

Method of Appointment

The Chair will be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendation of the DVC(R&D).

Members

Method of Appointment

Members (including relevant experts) shall be appointed by the DVC(R&D) or delegate. In recommending appointments, the DVC(R&D) or delegate shall have consulted with the Chair of the Committee and other parties as appropriate to ensure minimum/maximum current membership and diversity accords with any legislative and other obligations.

Secretary

Method of Appointment

The Secretary will be appointed by Swinburne Research.

OPERATING PROCEDURES

Quorum

The quorum for meetings shall be at least one member from each Category. Where current membership extends beyond 4 members, Categories C plus D should represent no less than one third of members.

Meetings

- 1. The Committee shall meet in an ordinary deliberative capacity on at least two times a year or with regard to external regulatory requirements.
- 2. Minutes shall be maintained by the office for Research.
- 3. The Committee is required to provide a written report to the Swinburne Council or delegate on its activities at least annually in accordance with the Australian Code for the care and use of animals for scientific purposes (8th Ed). It will also report to NH&MRC and State Government as required.
- 4. The Committee may establish an Executive that must include one member from Category C or D.
- 5. The Executive may approve minor modifications to projects and deal with emergencies. The Executive may not approve new proposals. Any decisions taken by the Executive must be reviewed by the Committee at its next meeting.
- 6. Members must declare any conflicts of interest before any business pertaining to a particular interest is considered by the Committee. The affected member(s) must absent themselves from any decision pertaining to their particular conflict of interest and, albeit at the Committee's discretion, shall ordinarily not be present at a meeting when any such decision is determined.

Attendance at meetings

A member from each Category A-D is required to attend each meeting. Categories C plus D should represent no less than one third of members present.
