
INDUSTRY STUDY TOURS

Industry study tours are designed to give you experience that will benefit your career.

You will have the opportunity to increase your cultural awareness and gain an insight into practices in the developing world; working alongside local staff providing basic education to children and providing education and vocational training to young women.

The tours give you credit towards your degree and offer a unique opportunity to enrich your learning.

When: Enrol for Summer Term, 2016

Travel periods:

- Samoa 8 23 December 2015
- India 3 22 January 2016
- Philippines 10 31 January 2016

Cost: Costs will vary for each study tour, according to the destination, duration and inclusions.

Scholarships: Once enrolled in this unit of study, students may have the opportunity to apply for scholarship funding. Scholarships will be available in the following equity categories:

- Students from low socio-economic backgrounds.
- · Indigenous students.
- Students from rural and remote areas.
- · Students living with disability.
- Women in non-traditional areas of study.
- Students from Non-English Speaking Backgrounds.

Eligibility

- Undergraduate students who commenced their degree in 2016 or later (excludes Open Universities Australia students).
- Undergraduate students who commenced their degree prior to 2016 may also apply prior to their final semester (excludes Open Universities Australia students).
- Additional selection criteria may apply.
