## Bachelor of Film and Television (Honours)

## Component Units

100 credit points  
Can be completed from a combination of the following:

### MINOR

A structured set of 4 units or 50 credit points from a field of study which you can choose in addition to a first major.

### ELECTIVES

A standalone unit from any study area.

50 / 100 Credit points
