Bachelor of Film and Television (Honours)

400 Credit Points

Core units 100 Credit points
A set of compulsory units you must complete as part of your Course.
Film and Television Major 200 Credit points
A structured set of 14 units or 200 credit points in a field of study specific to your course.

Component Units 100 credit points
Can be completed from a combination of the following:
MINOR A structured set of 4 units or 50 credit points from a field of study which you can choose in addition to a first major.
ELECTIVES A standalone unit from any study area.

Professional Placement 50 / 100 Credit points
