## Diploma of Emergency Health Care HLT51020

The **Diploma of Emergency Health Care** will qualify you to work for some state ambulance authorities and non-emergency patient transport companies to deliver patient care and transport services. You will gain the clinical skills and theoretical knowledge to treat and transport clients across pre-hospital and out-of-hospital care. You'll be qualified to work in the private and non-emergency patient transport sector as an Ambulance Transport Attendant (ATA).

**Location:** Unit delivery which occurs face-to-face may be at both Wantirna Campus and/or Best Practice site in Vermont
