Successful completion of a vocational qualification may also allow you to progress to another qualification with advanced standing.


Centre for Forensic Behavioural Science

Swinburne is home to the Centre for Forensic Behavioural Science, which brings together academics, clinicians, researchers and students from a variety of disciplines in forensic mental health research and practice.

The aims of the centre are:

- to understand, predict and ultimately reduce offending and violence by people with mental illness or problem behaviours
- to improve the legal system through empirical research and policy analysis
- to create a vibrant culture of learning and research in the forensic mental health and behavioural science sectors.

Our courses

Diploma of Nursing (HLT54121)

Duration 1.5 years full-time

Campus Wantirna

Intake February, July

Build the essential skills and knowledge required to work under the supervision of a registered nurse as an enrolled nurse in a variety of healthcare settings. In this nationally accredited course you'll learn how to implement basic nursing care, assess patients' health and analyse health-related information.

The Diploma of Nursing involves 400 hours of supervised clinical placements in four key areas – aged care, mental health, sub-acute and acute care – to provide you with practical skills when you graduate.

On campus, learning takes place in a purpose-built labs, utilising state-of-the-art equipment that allows you to learn in a safe, simulated environment.

Major study areas include nursing communication, legal and ethical parameters, medication delivery, wound management, infection prevention; and mental, acute, chronic and aged care.

Our Bachelor of Nursing prepares you for the diversity and complexities of 21st century nursing. You'll benefit from our strengths in technology and innovation. You'll graduate as a registered nurse and be ready to pursue a career in a variety of fields, including in acute, rural, remote and international settings; in emergency medicine, aged care, mental health services, palliative care, rural and Indigenous healthcare, family health, paediatrics and community nursing.

Graduate Diploma of Forensic Mental Health Nursing

Duration 2 years part-time

Campus Online

Intake Semesters 1 and 2

Incorporating: Graduate Certificate in Forensic Mental Health Nursing

Acquire knowledge and skills to work in forensic mental health nursing. This course offers a comprehensive introduction to the principles and practice of nursing in forensic mental health for general psychiatric nurses.

You'll learn about key legal principles and legislation, and core clinical skills such as violence risk assessment and management. You'll also develop an understanding of legal and correctional systems and learn how to work effectively with challenging patients and behaviours.

By the time you graduate, you'll have the skills to work effectively in forensic contexts or with forensic patients.

This course is offered through the Centre for Forensic Behavioural Science at Swinburne in collaboration with the Victorian Institute of Forensic Mental Health (Forensicare).
