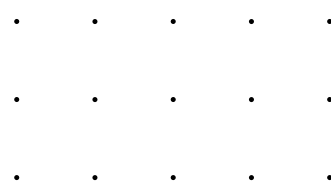

Monitoring progress is an integral aspect to ensure project success from conceptualisation to the end result.

In this cluster we explore how to establish and execute projects whilst investigating key aspects of the project life cycle. Communication is key to this, which is why we also look at preparing and recording meeting outcomes.

We look at everything from expenditure, financial reports, cost-analysis tools, valuations and contracts, project scheduling tools and methods, progress planning, performance management, goals, objectives and outcomes.

- assist with project time-lines, from creating and implementing schedules, to assessing time management during the project
- assist in managing project budgets, resources and costs, from understanding the budget to compiling costs throughout the life of the project.
