IN THE HEART OF MELBOURNE

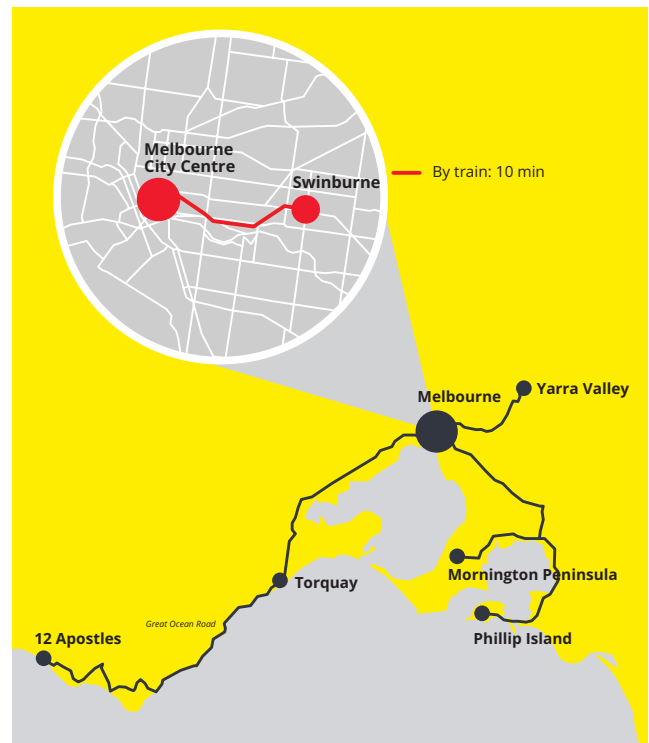

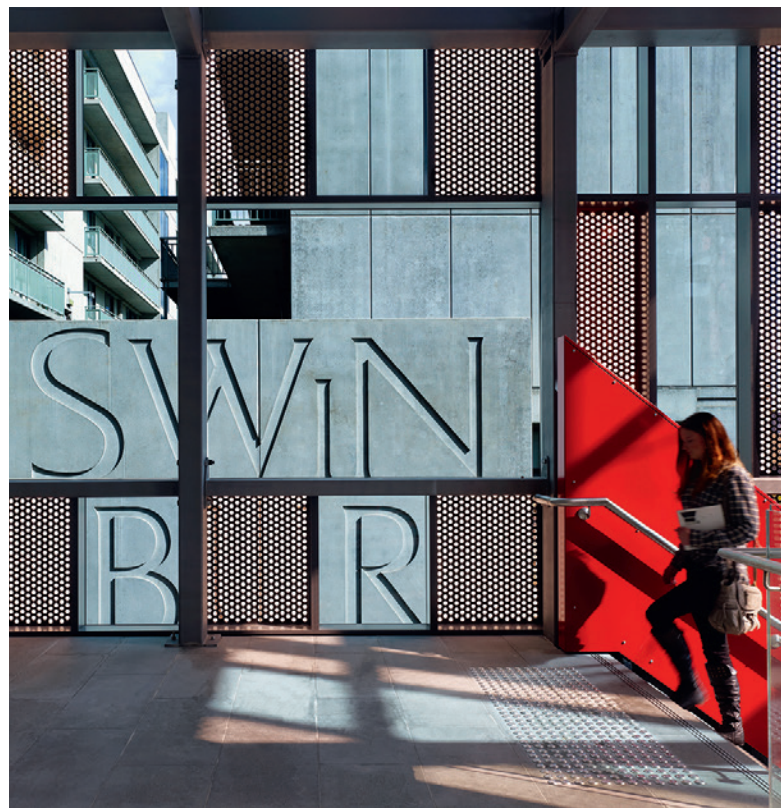

FOUNDATION YEAR

Swinburne Foundation Year is a pre-university program for international students. It is designed to help you make a smooth transition into university by developing your study and learning skills.

Upon successfully completing Swinburne Foundation Year, you are guaranteed a place in your preferred degree at Swinburne as long as you meet the bachelor degree entry requirements and prerequisites.

If you don't wish to transfer directly into a bachelor program, you can keep studying in a supportive environment through one of our UniLink Diploma programs, before entering the first or second year of a Swinburne bachelor degree.

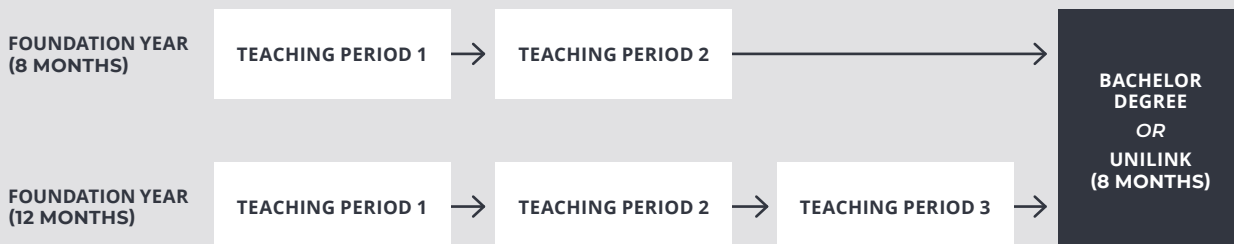

UNILINK DIPLOMA

UniLink Diplomas are accredited, award-level higher education qualifications that provide an alternative pathway to the first or second year of a range of bachelor degrees offered at Swinburne.

The course content is similar to the first year of a bachelor degree but the classroom environment is different. Classes are smaller and you will have more individual attention from your teachers to help you adjust to university. Your class will include local and international students, providing an enriching study experience.

By successfully completing all units of study of a UniLink Diploma, you are guaranteed a place in the first or second year of a related Swinburne bachelor degree.

Students must achieve a 75% average in Teaching Period 1 of UniLink (8 months) for entry. Students exiting after one teaching period will not receive the UniLink Diploma qualification. Students must pass all units for entry.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION

Graduates of a vocational advanced diploma or diploma can progress to a Swinburne undergraduate degree, subject to academic performance requirements.

You'll receive credit for your studies, allowing you to advance to later stages of your chosen degree.

Diplomas and certificates focus on learning for work and aim to build the skills and technical expertise that make you employable. They offer independent learning with an emphasis on workplace and practical skills. There are more contact hours, smaller classes and more personal communication with your teachers.

CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Designed for those who are interested in working in the children's services sector or who are already working in the field and are responsible for planning, implementing and managing programs in early childhood services. In most states, this is the highest qualification required at director or service manager level for children's service centre-based care.

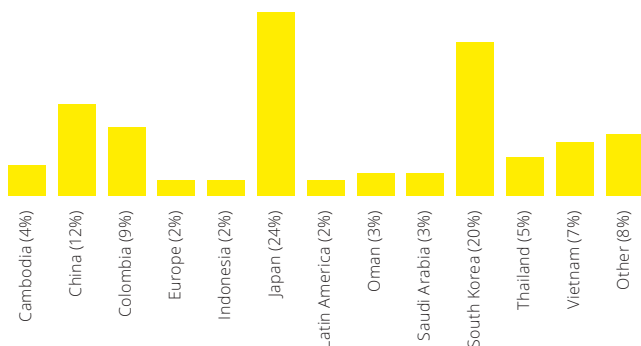

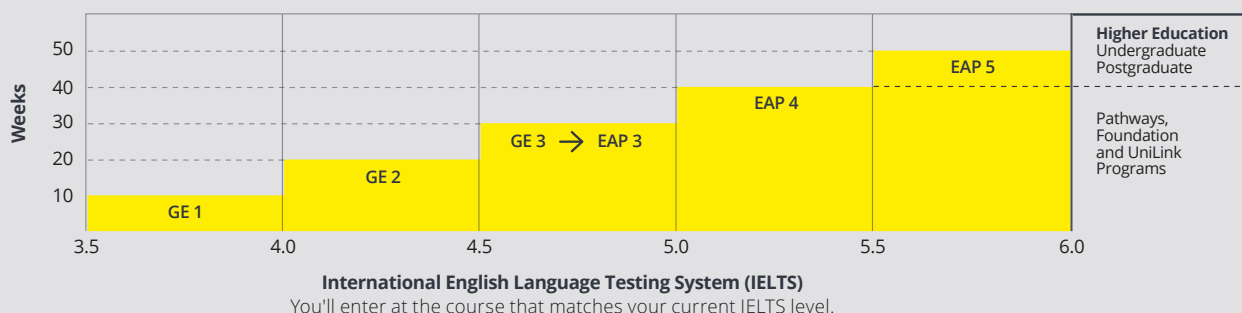
These fun and interactive classes are designed to maximise your independence and personal development. They'll help you improve your overall English so you can speak with confidence and take on our higher level English programs.

These courses are a step up from General English and will give you direct pathways into Swinburne's certificate, diploma, bachelor, master and even PhD courses. You'll delve into the finer details of effective and persuasive communication to help prepare you for success in your studies and career.

These classes use scientifically-supported learning strategies and real-world case studies. You'll learn how to critically analyse and respond to a range of current media, including TED talks. If you want to pursue further studies at Swinburne, you'll need to complete EAP with a minimum IELTS score of 5.5.

MASTERS QUALIFYING PROGRAM

The program combines English language training and academic studies to equip you with the skills you'll need to succeed in postgraduate study.

Successful completion of the MQP provides a guaranteed pathway to the first year of a range of postgraduate degrees and double degrees in accounting, business administration, entrepreneurship and innovation, finance and banking; human resource management; marketing and social impact.

The purpose of the Masters Qualifying Program [Business] is to provide an entry pathway to students who have completed a non-NOOSR (National Office of Overseas Skills Recognition) accredited degree. This program will give prepare you for Masters study whilst completing study that will make your current degree up to the standard of an Australian degree.

At completion of the Masters Qualifying Program [Business], you will be able to:

- think critically and have developed analytical skills so that you can identify, research and creatively solve problems within business contexts
- identify and understand the issues facing organisations and the contexts in which they operate
- communicate effectively in academic and business contexts

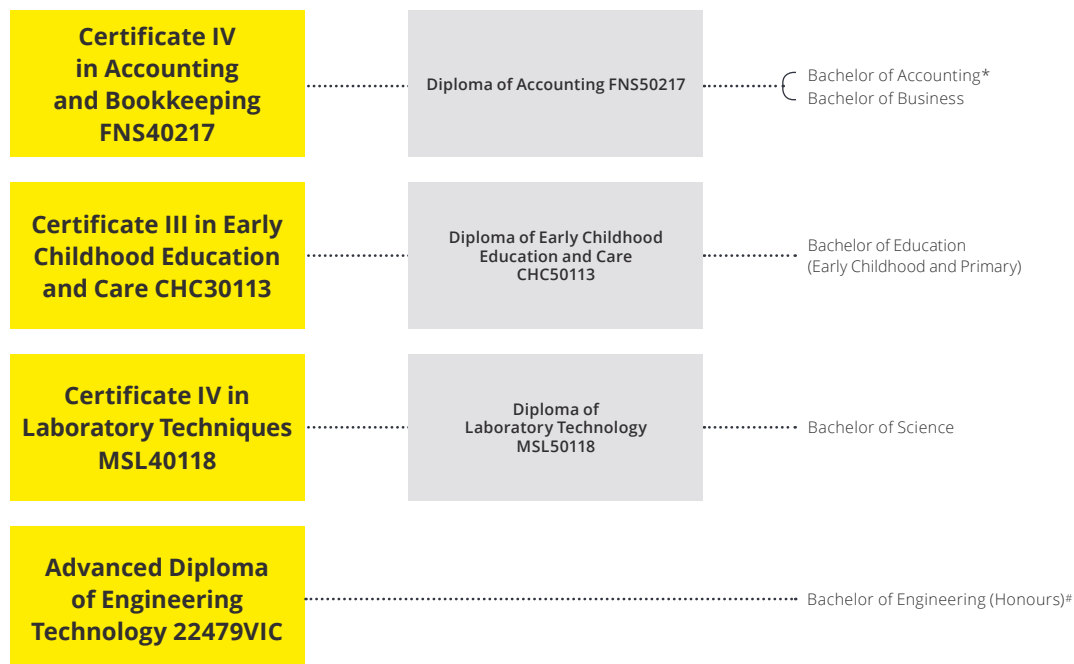
