



Senior Resident Advisor Scholarship 2018

Swinburne Student Residences

(Two positions)

Overview

The Senior Resident Advisor Scholarship provides outstanding leadership opportunities to senior students residing at Swinburne Student Residences. Under the direction of the Residential Life Coordinator, the Scholarship recipient is required to provide leadership to the Resident Advisors Team as well as working with them to plan and implement a range of support programs. The SRA is responsible for providing leadership and positive role modelling in the residential community; contribute to the development and well-being of residents by providing these students with support, guidance, and intellectual leadership; contribute to the building of an integrated residential community and the development of good citizenship.

Eligibility to apply for the scholarship

To be considered for the scholarship, you need to:

- demonstrate academic excellence;
- demonstrate outstanding leadership, communication and interpersonal skills in leading a team;
- demonstrate strong organisational skills to plan, coordinate and implement programs;
- demonstrate ability to empathise and interact with students from diverse backgrounds
- demonstrate ability to prioritise their RA role over casual employment or other non-university commitments
- be an Australian citizen or holder of a permanent resident visa or humanitarian visa for Australia; or be an international student with appropriate student visa;
- be a full-time student at the University;
- have no history of misconduct or conduct of concern to the University (inclusive of Residences)

Term of the scholarship

Subject to continued fulfilment of the requirements of the SRA Scholarship, the scholarship will run from 31st January until 24 November 2018

Value of Scholarship

The Senior Resident Advisor will be awarded the full value of the scholarship worth \$3 500 per semester, subject to mid-year review.

Requirements of the SRA scholarship

Leadership

- Provide leadership and demonstrate positive role modelling in all aspects of residence life, including building a positive and respectful culture in the Resident Advisors team and the Residences.
- Provide support and leadership to the Resident Advisors team to ensure the team functions effectively and professionally.
- Lead, plan and coordinate semester 1 and semester 2 Orientation Week Programs with the Resident Advisors team; attendance at all events is compulsory
- Assist the Residential Life Coordinator in monitoring the performance of the Resident Advisors team. This is to ensure the RA's undertake their duty and responsibilities in accordance with the Resident Advisor's Scholarship Requirements.
- Assist the Residential Life Coordinator in conducting some sessions during the Resident Advisors Training.
- Hold regular informal team meetings with all RAs (minimum fortnightly);
- Meet with the RA's one on one at least once every two months;

Residential Life

- Proactively meet and engage with all assigned residents on a regular basis and provide support and pastoral care as required;
- Hold one floor/building meeting with residents within the first two weeks of each semester;
- Hold a meeting with residents of each apartment within the first month of each semester;71
- Encourage and support residents to participate in activities in the residences, and to interact with each other;
- Maintain a high physical presence and profile in the Residences;
- Work with the Residential Life Coordinator to coordinate, plan and implement the portfolio programs with the Resident Advisors.
- Set up and maintain the calendar of events and programs for each semester for the Residences by the end of RA training.

Conduct

- Ensure residents uphold relevant University and Residences policies and guidelines by responding to and reporting on incidents of misconduct;
- Adhere to protocols set out at the Resident Advisors training, and policies and guidelines of the University when responding to emergencies or incidents of misconduct;
- Not engage in misconduct or any conduct of concern to the University; or any illegal activity

General

- Reside in Swinburne Student Residences during the term of the RA scholarship;

- Complete the following training/course/check:
 - Compulsory Resident Advisors training at the start of the academic year and mid-year, and any additional training deemed necessary by management;
 - Mental Health First Aid Training;
 - Consent Matters Training;
 - Senior First Aid Qualification;
 - A Volunteer Working with Children Check (prior to taking up the SRA position).
- Attend the following meetings and events:
 - mandatory meetings with the Residential Life Coordinator (minimum once a fortnight)
 - contribute to regular RA meetings as set by the Residential Life Coordinator
 - all residential portfolio events
- Assist the Residential Life Coordinator and residential staff with the coordination of Open Day in the Residences;
- Being available to check in residents during the major check in days for residents (including weekends) – start of the year and midyear;
- Submit a monthly team report to the Residential Life Coordinator, as per instruction
- Three weeks of leave will need to be taken up by end of October.
- Not engage in any casual or part time employment or other commitments that hinder your ability to meet the requirements of the SRA role.

Termination

Swinburne University may terminate this Scholarship immediately by notice in writing to the Senior Resident Advisor if the Senior Resident Advisor is in material breach (or persistent breach) of the requirements of the Residences License Agreement or the Code of Conduct. Termination may also apply if the SRA is found to be incapable or unwilling to adhere to the scholarship requirements.

Reviews

Monthly

The Residential Life Coordinator will conduct a monthly review of the Senior Resident Advisor's progress.

End of semester

The Associate Director of Student Housing and Finance and the Residential Life Coordinator will undertake a review the Senior Resident Advisor's performance in the role and assess if the person has fulfilled the requirements of the scholarship.

Semester 1 scholarship holder will be considered for the Semester 2 scholarship. The Associate Director of Student Housing and Finances may revoke the scholarship if it is shown that the person is not fulfilling the requirement of the scholarship.

Note:

This stipend will be in the form of a rental rebate.

If you do not complete the full term of the scholarship, you will be required to pay the full Licence Fee from the date you cease SRA duties, or cease living in Residence for the term of your License Agreement.

Number of Scholarships:	2 per semester
Term of Scholarship:	31 January – 1 July 2018
Applications Close:	29th September 2017
*Compulsory RA Training:	31st January-2nd February 2018 5th-9th February 2018 20th-21st July 2018
Term of scholarship (Semester 2):	2 July – 24 November 2018

Note: The dates of the compulsory RA training may be subject to change, by which the Residential Life Coordinator will advise.

Application

All applications must include:

- A Senior Resident Advisor Application Form
- A signed personal statement, clearly addressing your eligibility for the scholarship
- Two Referee Reports sent directly to the Residential Life Coordinator
- A copy of your current academic transcript (or proof of enrolment if currently completing a postgraduate degree by research)
- Proof of Australian Citizenship or permanent residency or appropriate student visa for international students
