Important Information about Changes to Your Course

The Bachelor of Behavioural Studies (Psychology) changed to the Bachelor of Psychological Sciences from Study Period 1, 2017.

HOW DO THE CHANGES AFFECT ME?

If you were admitted into the Bachelor of Behavioural Studies (Psychology) prior to 2017, you have the choice to continue under your existing course structure and rules OR transition across (transfer) to the Bachelor of Psychological Sciences.

NOTE: If you chose to remain in the Bachelor of Behavioural Studies (Psychology), you need to complete both PSY30009 Social Science (final offering SP3 2018) and STA20006 Multivariate Statistics (final offering SP1 2019). If you don't, you will be required to transition to the new course (Bachelor of Psychological Studies) due to Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) requirements in order to be eligible to graduate.
