For students admitted between 2017 to 2019 into the **Bachelor of Behavioural Studies**.

To qualify for a Bachelor of Behavioural Studies a student must complete 300 credit points comprising:

- 4 Behavioural Studies - Introductory units (50 credit points)
- 7 Psychological Studies Major units (100 credit points)
- PLUS Secondary studies (150 credit points) comprising an approved co-major (8 units); AND/ OR 1 to 2 minor/s, and/or single unit electives.

Regardless of any credit awarded within this degree, students must complete a minimum of 8 units of study with Swinburne University as part of this degree.
