Project management professionals are expected to be in high demand now and into the future as job numbers in the sector are forecast to grow by 33 percent globally from 2017 to 2027.*

That's 22 million new jobs with titles such as Project Management Officer (PMO), Project Manager, and PMO Director.

With a Master of Project Management (Advanced) or (Professional), you'll find job opportunities across public and private sectors in almost every industry. Certain industries, including telecommunications, finance, construction, information technology, healthcare, energy, aerospace and defence are considered to be current growth areas.
