# Entry requirements

- Bachelor of Aviation
  - ATAR 70+
  - Units 3 and 4: a minimum study score of 25 in English (or equivalent) or 30 in English (EAL)
  - Units 3 and 4: a minimum study score of 20 in Mathematical Methods
  - Skills Assessment Test (Moorabbin)
  - Note: a CASA Class 1 medical is required to undertake the course
- Bachelor of Aviation Management
  - ATAR 70+
  - Units 3 and 4: a minimum study score of 25 in English (or equivalent) or 30 in English (EAL)
  - Units 3 and 4: a minimum study score of 20 in Mathematics (any)

# Fees

- Aviation Management

Fees can be offset via HECS-HELP Loan

- Aviation

Academic fees can be offset via HECS-HELP Loan

Flight training fees can be offset via FEE-HELP Loan

Students co-enrolled in Graduate Certificate of Aviation (Piloting)

Nominal Flight Training Costs (with MCC/JOC) ~\$98k

Note: Flight Training Costs with Flight Instructor Rating ~ \$111k
