

What is VET in Schools?

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) is a Government initiative that offers secondary school students an option to complete VCE or VCAL while undertaking vocational studies at Swinburne. All VETiS programs must be either established or approved by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) (<http://www.vcaa.vic.edu.au>).

On successful completion of a VETiS program students will:

- VCE: achieve recognition within the Units 1 to 4 structure of Year 11 and 12 and may contribute towards satisfactory completion of the VCE. Selected programs also offer scored assessments for Units 3 and 4.
- VCAL: meet the requirements of the Industry Specific Skills Strand and may also contribute to the Work Related Skills Strand of VCAL and,
- Qualification: upon satisfactory completion of the program, be eligible for a Victorian or nationally recognised certificate.

Why choose VET training?

Students who successfully complete a VCE or VCAL with a vocational component have distinct advantages worth considering:

- Two certificates: VCE/VCAL and a nationally recognised vocational qualification
- Direct articulation into further study is often available e.g. Certificate III, IV or Diploma courses
- Improved opportunities for employment by providing links with industry.

Employability skills

Employability Skills are generic skills that contribute to a graduate's effective and successful participation in the workplace. Employability skills are embedded in each unit of competency within the programs.

The application of each skill and the level of detail in each unit will vary according to industry requirements and the nature of the unit of competency.
